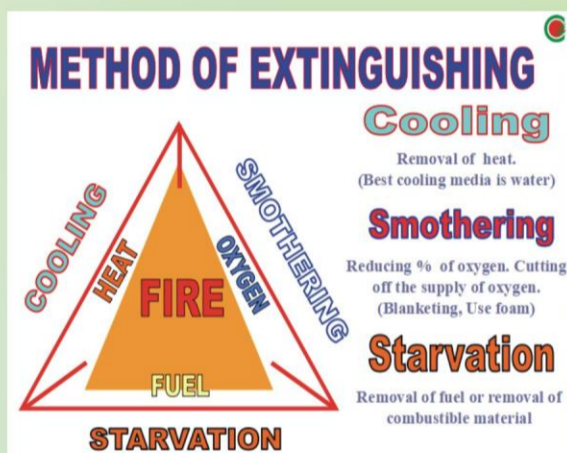
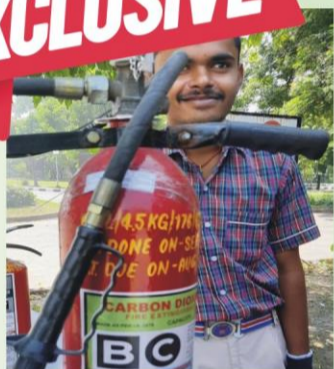
Dear Readers

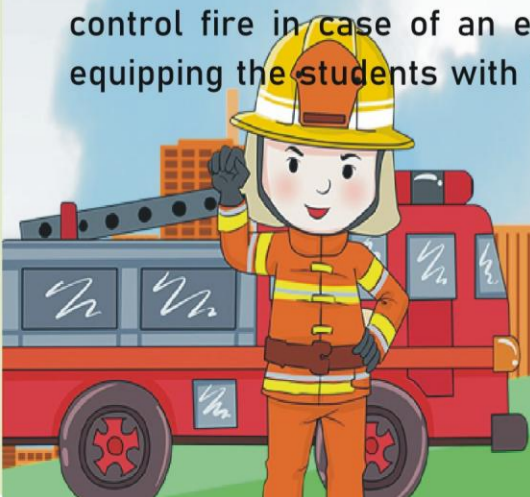

fire extinguishers. Practical demonstration and training was imparted to each of the participants in using an extinguisher to control fire in case of an emergency. The drill was helpful in equipping the students with lifesaving skills and to respond and

act safely to minimize the loss of life and property. Above all, proper knowledge can help avert the panic situation.

We are truly grateful to the CFCL Fire and Safety Department for the exhaustive training and drill. Presenting some tips and guidelines for the readers' awareness.

1. Don't panic.
2. Inform suitable agency. (Emergency numbers)
3. Open all doors and windows.
4. Identify the type of fire as it will help in choosing the suitable extinguisher.
5. In case of emergency siren, gather at the nearest identified assembly point for safe evacuation.
6. In daily routine, be cautious and check all problem creating situations.

CLUBS

They learnt about properties of light and also prepared models related to this. These activities prove helpful to develop scientific attitude and interest in students.

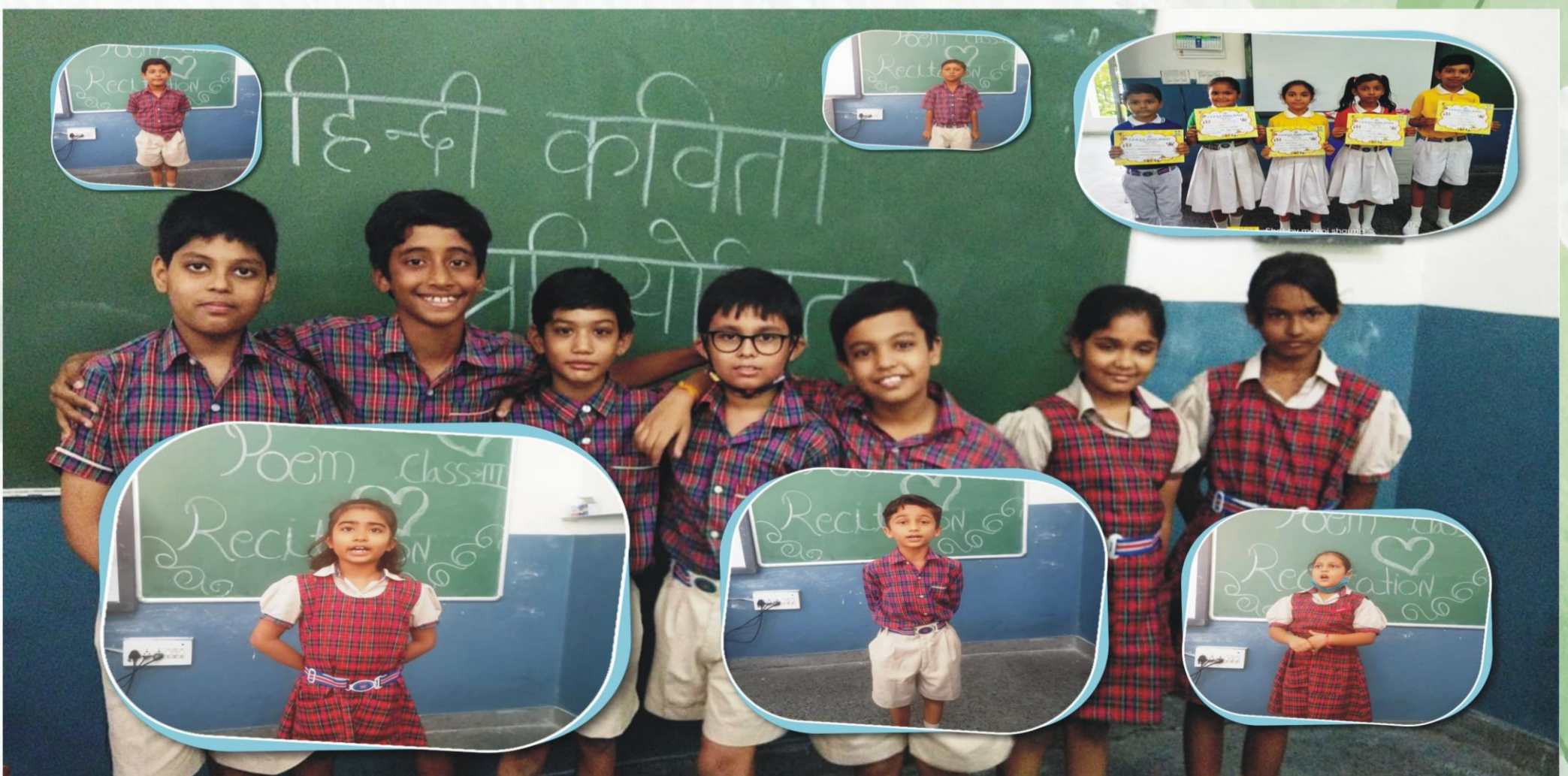
