According to data by Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, every year, approximately 1.5 lakh people die on India roads, which translate, on an average, into 1130 accidents and 422 deaths every day or 47 accidents and 18 deaths every hour. This might seem just numbers to us, but think of the families and lives of the victims.

Death shatters the entire family and in case of injury resulting to handicap, the life in itself becomes painful and challenging.
