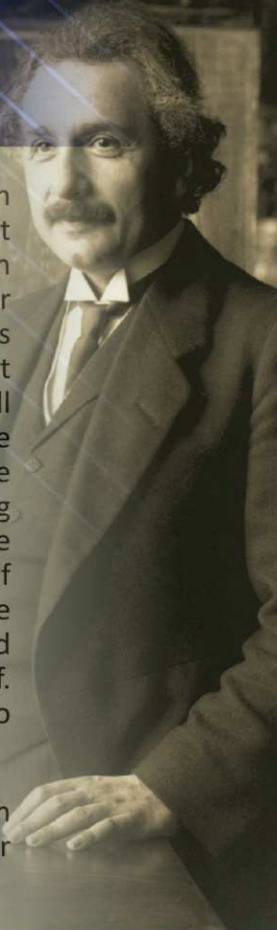

Their participation in the camp not only fostered personal growth but also strengthened their bond with fellow scouts and guides from different schools, promoting a spirit of unity and cooperation.



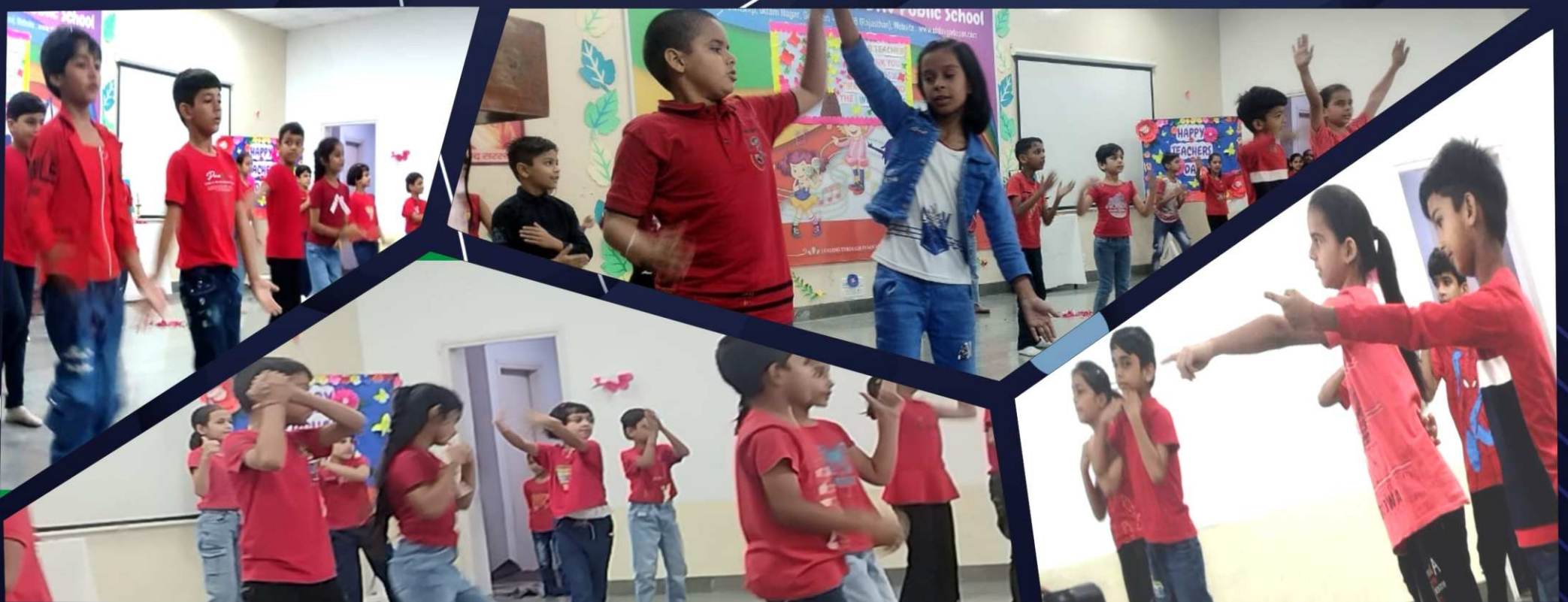

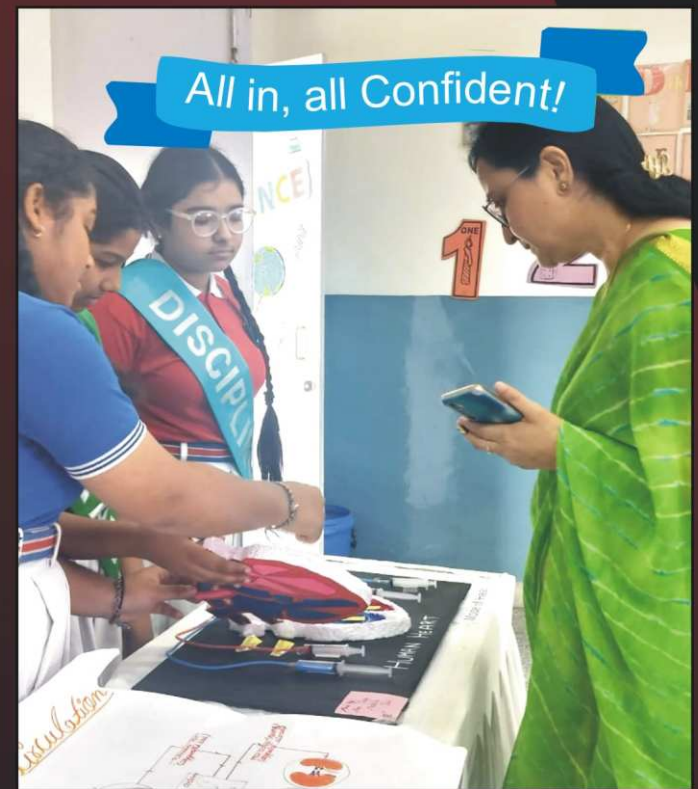
