At the end, Mr. U.R. Singh, VP, Works addressed the audience and praised the students who participated in this nukkad natak. He also added that we should also motivate

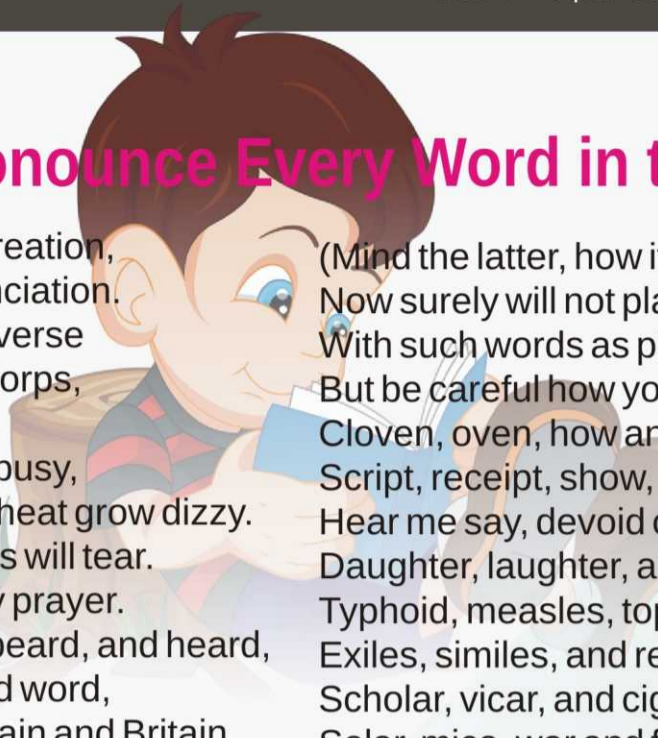
