
The achievement of our girls is particularly noteworthy

# The Interesting Genre of Detective and Mystery Stories

etective and mystery stories are loved by one and all. The hair-raising adventure, the nail-biting suspense and the blood curdling thrill enhances the fascination of these stories. The situation is such forceful that many times it becomes impossible the put the book down before you reach the end, and the mystery gets solved.

The credit for the first detective story goes to "The Murders in the Rue Morgue" by Edgar Allan Poe, published in April 1841. The profession of detective had come into being only a few decades earlier, and Poe is generally thought to have been influenced by the Mémoires of François-Eugène Vidocq, who in 1817 founded the world's first detective bureau, in Paris.

The greatest of all fictional detectives, Sherlock Holmes, along with his loyal, somewhat obtuse companion Dr. Watson, made his first appearance in Arthur Conan Doyle's novel A Study in Scarlet (1887) and continued into the 20th century in such collections of stories as The Memoirs of Sherlock Holmes (1894) and the longer Hound of the Baskervilles (1902).

In an age when the children are addicted to devices such as mobiles and play stations, which can cause severe health issues like weak eyesight, mental and emotional disorder, attention deficit issues, etc. parents should make them in a habit of reading books of their interest.


